Dear Colleagues:

The Connecticut Council Of Language Teachers will present its annual poetry recitation contest in American Sign Language, Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin only), English To Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL/ELL), French, German, Ancient Greek, Modern Greek, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Latin, Portuguese, Polish, Russian and Spanish on Monday – March 17, 2014 (snow date-March 18, 2014). The contest will take place at Central Connecticut State University in New Britain (860-832-2875). The contest will begin promptly at 3:30 p.m. and will end by 6:30 p.m.

We take great pleasure in inviting your school and its world language students to participate in this event. Last year's contest received such enthusiastic support that it attracted over 650 students from over 90 schools. We hope that your school will choose to participate in this exciting event this year.

Each school may enter **ONE student per level per language** except for the heritage speaker categories in which up to THREE students may be entered. **The fees for the contest are as follows: a \$35.00 entry fee for EACH school and a \$7.00 registration fee for EACH participant.**

**PLEASE NOTE: For this year only, students will be allowed to participate in only TWO languages.
If a student participates in TWO categories, a registration fee must be paid for each.
For example, 2 categories, 1 student =\$14.00**

Please make the check payable to "CT COLT". *Please send membership payments in a check separate from the Poetry Contest fees.* Enclosed are blank registration forms. Please follow the directions carefully to ensure acceptance of your registration materials. All registration materials must be POSTMARKED no later than January 24, 2014. Any incomplete entries or those received after the deadline date will be returned. Accuracy and timeliness are essential to the success of this endeavor. *Please note that the Rules, Form 1 and Form 2 have changed. Do not use forms from previous years.*

❸ **THREE COPIES** (*paper clipped together - please do NOT staple*) of the poem on an 8½"x 11" sheet with the following information written in the **Upper Right Corner**: **STUDENT NAME** (Last name, First name), **LANGUAGE & LEVEL** (*Please use the CT COLT name for the level – MSI, HSI, etc.*). Please number the lines of the poems. All Latin poetry should be scanned when submitted. Poems submitted on paper larger or smaller than 8½"x 11" will not be accepted. **Do not write the school name on the copies of the poem!!!** *Three copies of the poem must be submitted even if the poem is selected from the approved/required slate of poems for the language and level.*

❹ **Form 3** (*Alphabetized* list of participants with language and level.)

We encourage each school to hold its own mini-contest and then send the name of the candidate who best represents each category. IMPORTANT GUIDELINES – PLEASE READ VERY CAREFULLY

- **Limit of Contests per Student** – For this year, because the contest will be taking place in multiple buildings spread out over the campus, students will be limited to a maximum of TWO recitations. In this way, judges will not be waiting for students to arrive from multiple recitations, and the awards assembly should finish in a timely fashion.
- **CT COLT Membership Requirement**
 - ALL teachers entering students into the Poetry Recitation Contest MUST be current members of CT COLT when they register their students for the contest.
- **Registration Form 1 - School Registration Form**
 - Fill out this school form completely.
 - Check off the languages and levels for your school in the table.
 - At the bottom of the form, fill in the “Number of Participants”
 - Remember, students may only participate in a MAXIMUM of two languages.
 - Calculate the student fees by multiplying that number by 7.
 - Add in the School Fee.
 - Write in the TOTAL PAYMENT ENCLOSED.
 - CT COLT does not accept Purchase Orders. Please send membership payments in a separate check. All membership payments must be accompanied by a membership form for EACH person joining the organization.
- **Registration Form 2 - Student Registration Form**
 - Fill out this form COMPLETELY for EACH student from your school who is entering the contest.
 - Student registrations are entered into the database directly from **Form 2 - Student Registration Form**. If there is no form, the student will not be registered.
 - Circle the appropriate language and level for each student.
 - Staple a signed copy of the **Student Release Form** to EACH Registration Form 2.
 - With paper clips and NOT staples, attach three copies of the poems that each student is reciting to Registration Form 2, even if the poem is from selected from the required slate of poems for the language/level.
 - Please remember that students may participate in a maximum of TWO languages.
- **Registration Form 3 - Alphabetical Listing**
 - Write the names of the students from your school in ALPHABETICAL order. Please also indicate each student’s language and level.
 - When indicating the LEVEL for each student, use the CT COLT categories listed in the rules (French MS1, French HS1, Latin HS2, Latin MS2, etc.), do not simply write something like “French 1”. That is not sufficient and is incorrect.
 - You may substitute Form 3 with an ALPHABETICAL listing of students prepared on the computer.
 - **On the FIRST PAGE of Form 3, please write the Name(s) and Contact Information for possible judges for the contest.** CT COLT appreciates your help in securing judges: the more qualified experts we have, the more efficient and fair the judging.
- **Clarifications or Changes to the Rules/Procedures**
 - Aside from selections in Latin and Ancient Greek, only the MODERN form of standard dialects (Arabic, etc.) will be accepted.
 - Religious selections, such as Bible verses or passages from the Torah or the Koran, will not be accepted. All poems are to be secular in theme.
 - Poems in Latin and Ancient Greek should be properly SCANNED or the student will be disqualified.
 - Poems must be submitted in the ORIGINAL language – NOT IN PHONETICS – or students will be disqualified.
 - Teachers must submit CORRECTLY typed or scanned poems. Students will be disqualified if there are errors in the poem.
 - Teachers must share the grading rubric with their students so that they students are aware of the criteria by which their recitations will be judged. The grading rubric is located at www.ctcolt.org/Poetry/2014_Poetry_Rubric.pdf.
 - In **Arabic, ASL, ESL/ELL, Modern Greek, Japanese, Korean and Russian**, teachers and students should select poems that are LEVEL-APPROPRIATE. For example, a student in MS1 should not recite a poem that is extremely difficult or that he/she does not understand. The student will most likely end up receiving a poor score. On the other hand, students in HS5-6 should recite poems that are appropriate to that level of instruction. Selecting a poem that is very basic and more appropriate for HS1 or HS2 will most likely lower the students’ scores because the judge considers the poem to be too basic for the HS5-6 level of instruction.
 - In **Ancient Greek, Chinese, French, German, Italian, Latin, Polish, Portuguese and Spanish**, students must recite poems from the approved slate of poems for the appropriate language and level. If a student recites a poem that is NOT on the approved slate of poems for the language and level, the student will be disqualified. **Three copies of the poem must still be sent in even if the poem is listed on the approved slate of poems found at <http://coltpoetrycontest.weebly.com>.**
 - **The High School HERITAGE category will be divided into two groups: Heritage 9-10 (Grade 9 and 10 students) and Heritage 11-12 (Grade 11 and 12 students). Each school may submit THREE participants TOTAL for the combined HERITAGE categories (Heritage 9-10 and Heritage 11-12). This is NEW for the 2014 contest.**
- **Verification Materials**
 - Approximately TWO weeks after you mail in your registration packet, you will receive a verification packet. PLEASE check the information on the verification sheets VERY CAREFULLY and report any errors or omissions. This will be your only opportunity to make corrections! Every year, errors are found but not reported by the contact person from the schools involved!!! This tells us that people are NOT checking the verification sheets carefully.

- I. There will be separate poetry recitation contests held at the same time in *sixteen* languages: American Sign Language, Ancient Greek, Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, ESOL/ELL, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Latin, Modern Greek, Portuguese, Polish, Russian and Spanish. **Students may participate in only ONE language for this year's contest.** In the languages of Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, French, German, Modern Greek, Italian, Japanese, Polish, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish, the following categories will apply:

- II. In Latin, the above categories of A, B and C will apply. In Ancient Greek, the above categories A, B, and C will apply.
- III. In Korean, only the above categories of D and E will apply.
- IV. American Sign Language (ASL):
- A. Categories and Levels
- Hearing
 - Hearing Impaired
 - Four Levels within each category: One Year, Two Years, Three Years, Three Years Or More
- B. Participants may sign in either the English version or the ASL version.
- C. Criteria for Judging
- Memorization
 - Diction (fluency of signing, clarity of signing, manner in which the signs are linked)
 - Interpretation (accuracy of signing, effectiveness of the signs on the viewer)
- V. English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL/ESL) will include the following categories:
- A. Middle School: High-Beginner-MS, Intermediate-MS, Advanced-MS
- B. High School: High-Beginner-HS, Intermediate-HS, Advanced-HS
- C. Criteria for judging
- As with last year, we will follow the CT COLT judging rubric (www.ctcolt.org/Poetry/2014_Poetry_Rubric.pdf) in conjunction with the LAS Links Proficiency Guidelines.

- VI. The Heritage Speaker Category (Heritage 9-10 and Heritage 11-12)
- A. This category includes students whose home language is Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Modern Greek, Polish, Portuguese, Russian or Spanish
OR
students who have learned the world language of the contest through extended residence abroad (for example, more than one year) within the last FIVE years.
- B. These students, REGARDLESS OF THE COURSE IN WHICH THEY ARE PRESENTLY ENROLLED, MUST BE PLACED in the Heritage Speaker category.
- C. A school may enter a maximum of THREE STUDENTS in the Heritage Speaker category. This means that a

school may register a TOTAL of THREE students from the combined Heritage 9-10 and Heritage 11-12 categories. For example, you may register one student in Heritage 9-10 and two students in Heritage 11-12. You may NOT register SIX total heritage speakers. On the Middle School level, there may be up to THREE students in the Heritage-MS category per language.

VII. Length of Poems/Poetry Contest Slates

- Poems for Middle School and Level HS1 **must** have between 10 – 20 lines. Levels HS2 and above **must** have between 14 – 30 lines. **Students whose poems do not meet this length criteria will be disqualified.**
- Students reciting in the following languages MUST use poems from the approved slates at <http://coltpoetrycontest.weebly.com>: Ancient Greek, Chinese, French, German, Italian, Latin, Polish, Portuguese, and Spanish. **Since teachers were invited to submit their own selections, which were added to the slates, no other additional poems will be accepted.**
- Students reciting in Arabic, ASL, ELL/ESL, Modern Greek, Japanese, Korean and Russian may select a poem of **appropriate** length and level as in the past.
- The judging rubric, to be shared with ALL students, is found at www.ctcolt.org/Poetry/2014_Poetry_Rubric.pdf. Students will be judged in four areas: memorization, diction, interpretation, and body language.
- Latin and Ancient Greek poetry must be recited according to the classical metrics. **If a Latin or Ancient Greek poem is incorrectly scanned, there will be a -5 point deduction from the participant's score. If the poem is not scanned at all, the student will be disqualified.**
- ASL will be judged according to the guidelines stated under RULES, Section I, IV.
- If a student participated in previous years, he/she may NOT use the same poem. **The student will be disqualified if he/she recites a poem that he/she has previously recited at the contest.**
- The poem may NOT be an original poem written by the student.
- The participants will be judged by a panel, selected by the CT COLT Poetry Contest Committee. **ALL DECISIONS OF THE JUDGES ARE FINAL!**

VIII. Theatrics and props are NOT to be used. Interpretation should emphasize voice and words with appropriate gestures (*with the exception of ASL*). If the judges determine that a participant is presenting his/her poem with excessive dramatization and/or uses props, the participant will be disqualified.

IX. THREE (3) prizes for each level of each language. In the event that the category must split because of large enrollment, THREE (3) prizes for each room will be available. In addition, all participants will receive certificates of participation. Prizes will be awarded based on the following point system: FIRST PLACE (a minimum of 36 points out of a possible 40), SECOND PLACE (a minimum of 32 points out of a possible 40), and THIRD PLACE (a minimum of 28 points out of a possible 40).

X. Each school will be allowed to register **ONLY ONE** student per level per language with the exception of the Heritage Speaker Category in which there may be THREE enrolled for the Heritage-MS category and for all Heritage-HS categories (Heritage-HS 9-10 + Heritage-HS11-12 = THREE STUDENTS TOTAL).

XI. **PLEASE NOTE:** (Item “B” is NEW)

- A. The organizational scope of the contest does not permit us to have alternatives, poem substitutions or refunds. These types of requests will **NOT** be honored.
- B. Only the participants and judge(s) are allowed in the room during the recitation. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

PROCEDURES

XII. The school entry fee is \$35.00; the registration fee per student is \$7.00. All registration forms (one copy of each), poems (three copies of each on 8½ X 11 paper with the student's name, language and level printed in the upper right corner), and fees must be **postmarked** by January 24, 2014. **NO EXTENSIONS WILL BE GRANTED AND ANY INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE REJECTED.**

XIII. In the following languages that do not use the romanized alphabet (Ancient Greek, Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, Japanese,

Korean, Modern Greek, and Russian), the TITLE and AUTHOR must be provided using the romanized alphabet.

- XIV. In Mandarin Chinese, poems may be submitted using either the traditional or the simplified characters.
- XV. The Poetry Contest is not an event at which there are exhibitors. Under no circumstances will the dissemination of materials related to private businesses be allowed at this CT COLT event.
- XVI. If all of the above procedures are not followed, a student will not be allowed to participate. As stated above, judges and committee members have the right to disqualify any student who does not adhere to the recitation rules.
- XVII. Aside from selections in Latin, Ancient Greek, only the MODERN form of STANDARD dialects (Arabic, etc.) will be accepted.
- XVIII. Religious selections, such as Bible verses or passages from the Torah or the Koran, will not be accepted. All poems must be secular in topic.
- XIX. Poems should be submitted in the original language – NOT IN PHONETICS – or the students involved will be disqualified.
- XX. Teachers should submit correctly typed or scanned poems. Errors will result in penalties or disqualification.
- XXI. Teachers should share the grading rubric with their students in order that they will be aware of the criteria by which their recitations will be judged. The rubric can be found at www.ctcolt.org/Poetry/2014_Poetry_Rubric.pdf.
- XXII. The poem selected for the recitation should be LEVEL appropriate (not too easy/not too difficult).
- XXIII. Rulings by the judges are final.
- XXIV. **In addition to the school poetry contest contact person, classroom teachers whose students are reciting must also be members of CT COLT at the time of the contest.**
- XXV. Students, teachers and school officials should be aware that any FRAUDULENT ACTIVITY, including the substitution of poem and/or student, or Heritage Speakers registered for any Non-Heritage Speaker category, will lead to the DISQUALIFICATION of ALL participants from that school.
